**Interlocal Governmental Agreement
Between the County of Galveston, the City
of Texas City, and the City of Galveston**

2013 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program Award

This Interlocal Governmental Agreement is entered into in accordance with Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code. It is by and between the County of Galveston, the City of Texas City, and the City of Galveston. Its purpose is to agree to an equal split of the 2013 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant awarded of \$42,672.

Whereas, the County of Galveston, acting on behalf of itself and the other parties, has under joint application No. 2013-H5827-TX-DJ applied for and agreed to act as fiscal agent for the 2013 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) in the amount of \$42,672; and,

Whereas, each of the parties finds that the performance of this Agreement is in their best interest, that the undertaking of this Agreement will benefit the public, and that the equal division of the JAG award fairly compensates each party for the services or functions they are to render; and,

Now, Therefore, the Parties Agree as Follows:

Section 1.

County, as fiscal agent, agrees, within 45 days of the date of receipt of the 2013 JAG funds in the amount of \$42,672 to forward to the City of Texas City \$14,224, and to forward to the City of Galveston \$14,224. The County will retain the balance of the funds.

Section 2.

The funds each party receives will be used for the purposes set forth in the Program Narrative attached hereto as Attachment 1, unless subsequently modified in accordance with grant guidelines.

Section 3.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of services by the other party. But, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to waive the doctrine of sovereign or other form of immunity of any party. Nor shall this Agreement be construed to be for the benefit of or create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

TYPE OF PROGRAM TO BE FUNDED

The three jurisdictions participating in the joint application intend to use JAG funds to continue focusing in the Law Enforcement Programs. This proposal seeks to prevent or reduce crime and violence through the following efforts:

Proposing Agency: Texas City Police Department

The Texas City Police Department is looking to purchase Tactical Equipment, Tactical Patrol Equipment and Investigative Surveillance Equipment. This equipment may include items such as includes tactical patrol specialized uniforms, tactical "duty rigs", duty weapons, rifles and attachments, non- lethal weapons/Tasers, and covert surveillance equipment. The proposed equipment will outfit tactical patrol units enhancing the Officers safety and effectiveness of their crime suppression and reduction efforts.

Proposing Agency: Galveston Police Department


